

## DARKO DAROVEC

### CURRICULUM VITAE

**Prof. Dr. Darko Darovec** (1961) in 1998 successfully defended his doctoral thesis, entitled *The Economy of North West Istria in the Period of Decline of the Venetian Republic (16<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> Century) in the Light of the Activities of the “Monte di Pietà” Pawnshops in Koper and Piran*, and was promoted to PhD in Historical Sciences. From 2000 to 2012, he was Director of the Science and Research Centre of the University of Primorska of Koper. From 2000 to 2002, he was Acting Dean of the Faculty of Humanities of Koper and participated from the very beginning in the Dean’s programme for the design of both the Faculty and individual study programs. He actively participated in the establishment of the University of Primorska, as well. The Senate of the University of Primorska appointed him Research Counsellor in 2003, and in 2009 he became Full Professor for History. He directs the PhD candidates to high quality research. From 2001 to 2012, he was also employed as the holder of many courses at various levels of study at the Faculty of Humanities, but he is also the holder of many courses within the postgraduate study programs of various faculties. In addition to the above-mentioned functions, he was also the Consultant of the Rector (2007–2011) of the University of Primorska in the field of Development. He has participated at numerous international scientific meetings organized by the universities of Trieste, Udine, Bologna, Venice, Naples, Sassari, Zagreb, and Rijeka. He cooperated with the University of Wales, University of Western Australia, Northwestern University (USA), and others. He also organized more than 20 international scientific meetings in Slovenia in cooperation with other foreign scientists and international university institutions. Additionally, he was also the project manager and coordinator of many international projects and initiatives. Darovec is the Editor-in-Chief of the scientific journals *Acta Histriae* (since 1993) and *Annales: Series historia et sociologia* (since 1991). He was also the editor of scientific monographs within the collection “Annales.” His main fields of research are: medieval and modern history of Istria and the Mediterranean, with a special emphasis on law history, history of culture and economy.
